Dear Parents & Carers,

You will receive your child's termly report at our parents evening on the **Thursday 29th November**. A letter inviting you to parents evening along with details of the online booking system will have been sent home to you, if you haven't seen it, please check in book bags. Reception places are allocated in a cross London scheme which is organised by our local authority, Hackney Learning Trust, not the school. If you have a child who was born between 1st September 2014 to 31st August 2015 then you will need to make an application for a Reception place regardless of whether your child attends our Nursery or has a sibling already in the school. Our Reception classes are very popular so don't miss the deadline for these applications which is **Tuesday 15th January 2019**. DROP IN SESSIONS FOR PARENTS


Thank you to all of the Nursery, Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 parents who stay and read with their children on Friday mornings.
