




This game has ALL the times tables on it... it may be a little hard for you but it is still good practise and will earn you coins.

If you answer 30 or more questions you're a **Rock Legend!**


If you answer 60 or more questions you're a **Rock Hero!**



What is Mathletics?

- An online maths resource that children can access with unique login details - anywhere, anytime
- Allows students to practise maths concepts taught in school and become quicker at mental maths
- Based on new National Curriculum
- Contains fun problem solving games, a concept search tool, times tables songs and much more

Mathletics

How is it used?

- Children can access in school and at home and practise maths concepts with fun activities
- Teachers can set homework tasks on Mathletics.
- Teachers can monitor progress through their Teacher Centre
- Children are rewarded for continued progress and participation with points, certificates and credits to spend on their avatar in the online shop



Reward structure

- **Live Mathletics:** 1 correct answer = 1 point
- **Curriculum activities:** 1 correct answer = 10 points
- **Certificates:** maximum of 1 per week

1000 points in a week = 1 **bronze certificate**

5 bronze certificates = 1 silver certificate

4 silver certificates = 1 **gold certificate**



Click on avatar to personalise

Keep track of how many points gained in a day and in a week

As pupils master activities they gain Gold Bars, which unlock Problem Solving games

Play live maths games against children around the world

Look up and interact with maths concepts and vocabulary

Fun times tables songs in a range of musical styles, great for memorising



How can you help?

- Encourage your child to access Mathletics three times a week, for 20 minutes each time
- Remind them to use the question mark help button when doing an activity to get an explanation
- Explore Problem Solving activities, Concept Search, Rainforest Maths and Times Tables Toons together to vary their use and keep their interest high
- Print and display certificates when they are achieved to reward your child
