


Week 7 Topic task

Dr Barnardo was a doctor, from Ireland who made his mission to help children starving on the streets of Victorian London. He opened his own 'Ragged School' for free education and a shelter in Stepney, East London, for 50 boys offering work training and a place to live. One night a boy, nicknamed Carrots, was turned away because the shelter was full. He froze to death. Barnardo vowed never to turn a child away again.
