

Year 5 Literacy Skills LI: To write from character's point of view



Michael is a 10 year old boy who is on a trip of a life time, sailing round the world in a yacht with his parents. All is going well until....

'I heard the wind above me in the sails. I remember thinking, this is silly, you haven't got your safety harness on, you haven't got your lifejacket on. You shouldn't be doing this... I was in the cold of the sea before I could even open my mouth to scream.' – Michael

Can you now write a paragraph (from Michael's point of view) of when he was lost at sea?

For example:

I remember being baffled seeing my surrounding; the seaweed was wrapped around my little toe. Tiny, peculiar fish roamed around the water as if I had invaded their home. Their home! When I collected my thoughts together, I had realised I was lost!

- Sentence starters
- Adjectives for impact
- Powerful verbs to describe actions

Year 5 SPAG Skills

LI: To use semi colons accurately

Rule 1: The semi-colon can be used instead of a full stop.

It can link two complete sentences and join them to make one sentence. The semi-colon can be used <u>instead of</u> a connective to join the sentences.

Example 1: The door swung open; a masked figure strode in.

Example 2: Alex bought a toy car; he played with it as soon as he got

home.

Example 3: She was very tired; she had worked late the night

before.

So long as the second 'sentence' after the semi-colon links back to the first 'sentence,' it is correct.

Rule 2: The semi-colon can be used in a descriptive list.

Usually we use commas in a list however, when we describe each item in the list, the sentence is much longer meaning that a semi-colon is more appropriate.

(Before) At the circus we saw a clown, a lion, a fire eater and an eight year old acrobat.

(After) At the circus we saw a clown juggling with swords and daggers; a lion who stood on a ball; a fire eater with flashing eyes; and an eight year old acrobat.
