


## HISPANIC ART DAY 2020 FOR HOME LEARNERS

Nursery  Recep	<p><b>CASTANETS</b> <b>Instructions:</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1.-Cut to 3x14cm strips from card or cardboard.</li> <li>2.-Bend them in the middle cross side.</li> <li>3.-Glue buttons/bottle caps at each end, in the inside.</li> <li>4.-Decorate.</li> </ol> <p><b>Here are some questions you can use to prompt children:</b> Have you ever watched a flamenco dancer play amazing rhythms with wooden castanets? You can make your own version with buttons plus a bit of heavy card board. Then you can click and clack and dance away! Once you've made your colourful castanets, here are some music activities you might like to try:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <i>Make enough pairs for members of the family and play the same rhythm together</i></li> <li>• <i>Try making a rhythm with different patterns of right hand and left hand clicks. For instance, Right hand, Right hand. Left!</i></li> <li>• <i>Try playing along to music from Spain. Can you find patterns that fit the music?</i></li> <li>• <i>Try a call and response game. The adult makes one rhythm and the child must repeat what they hear. ## MINI PIÑATAS / MINI FRIDA PIÑATAS

### Instructions:

- 1.- Cut some strips of tissue paper that are long enough to fit around the tp roll and about 4-5cm wide. You can cut several strips in one go. (Variation: For each TP Roll Frida you will need 4 strips, ideally in different colours, but not essential).
- 2.- Cut a square piece of paper to comfortably fit around the bottom of the Toilet Paper Roll. Stick it at the bottom.
- 3.- Poke a hole through the centre of the paper first and secure your pulling string. Or you can tape it on later.
- 4.- Now add glue to the tissue paper strips and layer them around the Toilet Paper Roll one after each other.
- 5.- Make 2 holes at the top (you can use a single hole punch if you want, I used sharp scissors, or just glue it) and tie some string to make a handle.
- 6.-Variation: Draw the Frida face and decorate head with flowers.

## TAINO PETROGLYPHS NECKLACES

Taíno petroglyphs, found in caves and near rivers in Puerto Rico, Cuba, and throughout the Caribbean, are some of the oldest in the world. Kids can create their own “rock art” as they learn about the indigenous culture.

### Instructions:

1. Knead clay such as Model Magic (a little bigger than the size of a golf ball) until it's smooth.
2. Press it into a flat disk.
3. Etch designs into clay using carving clay tools and the pointed end of a toothpick.
4. Add a hole and string to make a necklace.

Tip: Dip a toothpick in water before carving designs to help the tip glide more smoothly.

## GOD'S EYE BROOCHES

"God's eye" are beautiful dream-catcher-looking creations were woven by the Huichol Indians of Mexico for good luck and protection; descendants are known to still make them today.

### Instructions:

1.-Connect your sticks: With a small bit of yarn, tie your two sticks together. Knot the yarn so it doesn't come undone.

2.-Wrap the yarn around the sticks: Firmly hold the end of your yarn against the center of the sticks. Wrap the yarn in a clockwise or counterclockwise direction (you decide – just be consistent) around one of the sticks.

Move on to the next stick and then wrap it again. (go to video to learn the 2 techniques)

Keep moving around in a circle, wrapping the yarn around each stick as you go.

If you run out of yarn or want to change colors, simply knot a new piece of yarn to the existing piece and keep going.

Make a knot around the stick when you're done.
