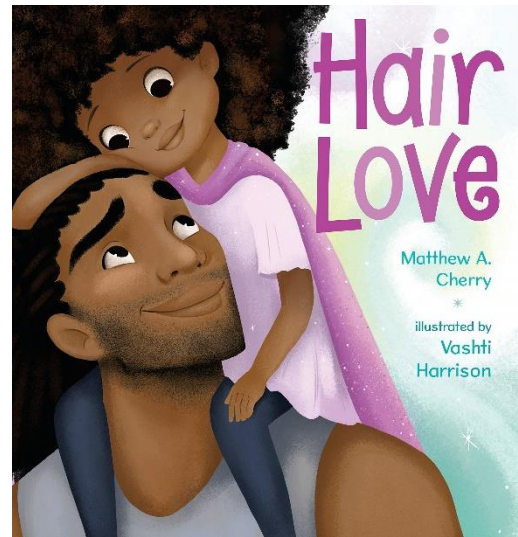

Some ideas you can use to help you:

- Her daddy tried to brush her hair but he got angry
- Her daddy watched lots of videos to help him
- They walked to the hospital
- Did they stop anywhere on the way?

Remember...

- To use full stops and capital letters
- To magpie words and phrases from the story
- Write in 1st person (I)
- To think carefully about how Zuri would be feeling as she was writing to her mum.
- To use precise, exciting adjectives
- To use expanded noun phrases - adjective, adjective noun (Eq. The bright, golden star)
- To use similes - using the word 'like' or 'as' to describe. (Eq. Her skin was as dark as the glowing, night sky. She ate foods that were as light as snow)
