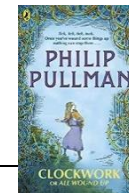

Why is there an image of a skeleton holding an hourglass? In the sentence which starts 'And they were darker' (page 83) why do you think the author uses the word 'and' a lot? <b>Clarify: flitted, lodging, slanting</b>
Wednesday 8.07.20	Read pages 84-85	<b>Inferring</b> The word * tells me... The part * suggests... This makes me think that... I think the character is..
