This has led to greater confidence and clarity over the curriculum. How are PSHCE lessons going? In Year 6 they are learning about keeping safe eg. if you saw a fire you must keep away and alert 999. In PSHCE we have been learning about stranger danger. Children spoke positively and confidently about the learning that has been taking place in PSHCE.
