




Before completing the task, read Man on the Moon (a day in the life of Bob).


Before completing the task, read 'Man on the Moon (a day in the life of Bob).

Genre: Narrative Week 1 - Day 4


LI: To write a conversation between 2 characters

How has your




Genre: Narrative Week 1 - Day 5 LI: To use descriptive language.

I can use capital letters and full stops


I can use a range of punctuation (.,!?)
