




I can use commas to separate more than one adjective e.g.

There are many secret aliens throughout this story. Look at the story again and see how many aliens you can spot on each page.


<u>Lesson 3:</u> Today you will write a paragraph describing your own alien. First, mind-map some words and phrases that describe your alien.


