Our topic this half term is Vikings

Literacy

As writers, we will be focusing on narratives, play scripts and persuasive writing. We will use the study of texts to develop and widen vocabulary and knowledge of year group spelling and grammar expectations (including using a variety of different structured sentences)

Mathematics

As mathematicians, we will be developing our understanding of different units of measures. We will use mm, cm and m to calculate perimeters and areas. We will be developing our understanding of time and use decimal denominations for money. We will be using a range of strategies to develop our ability to explain our thinking through reasoning and problem solving.

Science

As scientists, we will be exploring Sound. We will be exploring how sound is produced, which factors affect the pitch of sound and what the relationship between distance and sound are. We will be using scientific vocabulary to develop our knowledge and we will be using enquiry to draw conclusions from investigations.

In computer science, we will be using Espresso Coding to create animations.

Art and Design Technology
