Our topic this half term is: Blue Planet

Literacy

As writers, we will be exploring stories, using a range of adjectives to describe the scene and characters. We will have the opportunity to write and recite rhyming couplet poems and finally we will be producing non – chronological reports using a range of technical vocabulary.

Mathematics

As mathematicians we will be developing our understanding of addition and subtraction, using a range of resources to help us. We will also be looking at fractions, recognising, finding and naming a half as one of two equal parts or a quarter as one of four equal parts using objects, shapes or quantities.

Science

As scientists we will be exploring what we know about plants. We will be identifying and describing the parts of a plant and looking at the different types of plants in the local environment. We will be investigating the structure of plants and drawing conclusions about the structure of plants.

As Musicians we will be learning simple songs and rhymes with repeated language and beats.

ICT

We will be looking at simple algorithms to move images.

Art and Design Technology

As artists we will be making toys out of clay. We will explore ways in which we can mould and shape clay to create shapes. We will also learn to clay to produce a figurine that is recognisable.

Geography

As geographers, we will be looking at continents and oceans. We will be researching about the world's seven continents and five oceans using Google Earth, world maps, atlases and globes. We will be comparing the continents around the world looking at landmarks, locations, food, language, flags and climates.

Physical Education

As dancers we will be exploring different ways to move and balance. We will perform a range of sideways rolls and explore different ways to combine a balance and roll. We will then put all these skills together to perform a sequence of balances.
