# Our topic this half term is Rainforests

#### Literacy

As writers, we will be developing our skills as narrative writers. We will also be using a range of persuasive devices in our persuasive texts thinking carefully about the impact of word choice on the reader.

### **Art and Design Technology**

For Art we will be using mixed media to create a paint-based collage inspired by our last term's topic 'Vikings'

#### **Mathematics**

As mathematicians, we will be developing our place value knowledge. We will be interpreting and presenting discrete and continuous data using appropriate graphs. We will solve comparison, sum and difference questions using graphs. In Geometry, we will be identifying symmetry in 2D shapes and patterns.



#### Music

As Musicians, we will be performing an ensemble, with a focus on listening to one another and performing.

#### Science

As scientists, we will be learning about living things and their habitats. We will be classifying animals and justifying our groupings using classification keys. We will be exploring how habitats can be affected by their environments and explore the humans impact on habitats using observations in our local environment.

### Geography
