Chestnut: We enjoy that the tabletops have more activities to keep us entertained. Elder: We like playing with the connect 4 because it is a new game that is helpful with pattern recognition.  How do you think this provision in the playground could be improved?  Laurel: We all spoke about how great it would be to have monkey bars in our playground.
