
Over the last academic year, Viridis Schools has risen with energy to the challenges presented by the pandemic, learning to adapt and continuing to provide the best education for all pupils.

# WHAT HAVE WE BEEN TALKING ABOUT?



Governors have now returned to face-to-face meetings with the first Full Governing Body meeting of the year taking place in October.

Governors have been reviewing reports from the School Improvement Partner, school data analysis, sub committee meetings and the Executive Headteacher to inform their understanding of how the schools are doing. Governors have also been discussing issues that affect all three schools such as risk assessments, safeguarding systems and premises works that are necessary for our Victorian and Edwardian buildings.

This term, Governors are also ensuring new members of the team are effectively inducted and undertaking training to make sure that the Governing Body continue to be effective in the important role of holding the school leadership teams to account.

#### **GOVERNOR VISIT MORNING**



The Governor Visit Morning this term was to Hoxton Garden School and there was a focus on the writing curriculum. The data from teacher assessments at the end of the last academic year showed data comparable with that of 2019, prior to COVID-19 partial school closures. The reason that children have closed gaps so quickly is the result of a quick response by the schools and a focus on key skills learning to consolidate and pre-teach new grammar and vocabulary. Governors spent the morning visiting classrooms, meeting staff and speaking to children. A group of children were also invited to present their learning and experiences of writing, which led to a very useful question and answer session. Next term, Governors will visit Southwold School, with a visit to Orchard planned for the Summer Term.

#### **MEET OUR NEW GOVERNORS**
