Our topic this half term is 'Let's Work'

Communication and Language

We will be learning to:

- Use new vocabulary through the day.
- Understand how to listen carefully and why listening is important.
- Articulate our ideas and thoughts in wellformed sentences.
- Use talk to help work out problems and organise thinking and activities, and to explain how things work and why they might happen.

Literacy

We will be learning to:

- Read simple phrases and sentences made up of words with known letter– sound correspondences and, where necessary, a few exception words.
- Read books to build up our confidence in word reading, our fluency and our understanding and enjoyment.

Mathematics

We will be learning to:

- Count objects, actions and sounds.
- Subtilize look at a group of objects and realise how many there are without counting.
- Count objects, actions and sounds.
- Link the number symbol (numeral) with its cardinal number value.
- Count beyond ten.
- Compare numbers.



Physical Development

We will be learning to:

- Progress towards a more fluent style of moving, with developing control and grace.
- Develop our small motor skills so that we can use a range of tools competently, safely and confidently. Suggested tools: pencils for drawing and writing, paintbrushes, scissors, knives, forks and spoons.
- Use our core muscle strength to achieve a good posture when sitting at a table or sitting on the floor.

Understanding the World

We will be learning to:

- Name and describe people who are familiar to us.
- Comment on images of familiar situations in the past.
- Recognise that people have different beliefs and celebrate special times in different ways.

Expressive Art and Design

We will be learning to:

- Explore, use and refine a variety of art effects to express our ideas and feeling
- Return to and build on our previous learning, refining ideas and developing ability to represent them.
- Develop storylines in our pretend play
