Our topic this half term is The Romans

Literacy

As writers, we will be exploring Matilda and other texts in detail through reading and discussion. We will be focusing on both fiction and non-fiction genres and writing for a range of purposes.

Charlotte's web by E. B. White The Unlikely adventures of Mabel Jones by Will Mabbitt

Music

We will use percussion and simple wind instruments to make music using the Stone Age as inspiration.

Art and Design Technology

As artists, we will be learning about mosaic, taking inspiration from the Romans to create our own designs.

We will then produce our own mosaic tiles replicating the method.

Mathematics

As mathematicians, we will be developing our knowledge of multiplication and division. We will also be developing our knowledge of time, looking at both analogue and digital time and calculating durations of time.



History

As historians, we will be looking at artefacts to help us ask questions about the past. We will evaluate the reliability of sources, learn about the Romans and find out why their army was so successful in battle.
