Our topic this half term is Into the Cold

Literacy

As writers, we will be exploring texts in detail and looking at how we can develop our writing skills. We will be focusing on both fiction and non -fiction genres of writing. There will be opportunity to develop their ability to write recounts, reports and short stories, using new subject knowledge to enhance our writing.

Mathematics
