




WHO ARE WE AND WHAT DO WE DO?

WHAT HAVE WE BEEN TALKING ABOUT?

This term, the Governing Body has met as a full team, there have been sub-committee meetings for each school and the resources committee have met also. Governors have discussed key local issues including the recent announcement of school closures and amalgamations, reviewed end of year outcomes, looked at staff development, learnt about curriculum development, reviewed staff surveys and looked at key financial documents including how the schools spend the pupil premium and sports funding budgets. Governors review a range of reports including those from the School Improvement Partner, the Local Authority and the Department of Education to inform their understanding of how the schools are doing relative to others. GOVERNOR VISIT MORNING

Governor Visit mornings take place each term to enable a spotlight on aspects of the Federation provision. Our first Governor Visit Morning took place at Hoxton Garden with a focus on inclusion for all at Viridis Schools. Governors had the opportunity to see how adaptive teaching is applied to ensure all children make good progress from their starting points. A presentation was shared by the Lower School Deputy Headteacher and the SENCO, explaining systems and structures as well as the Federation Local Offer for children who are identified as needing extra support. Governors met with a group of children who explained how they are supported in school. The Governors who attended were very impressed with the quality of children's articulation and the evidence of high-quality learning in their workbooks. During a walk around the school, governors were able to experience first-hand how all abilities are catered for within lessons through resources, scaffolds and adult support. Our schools continue to ensure a teaching assistant is working alongside the class teacher which is an active budget decision to ensure adult to pupil ratios maximise rapid progress.





OUTSTANDING ACHIEVEMENTS

In the Summer Term, Year 6 sat their standard assessment tests in reading, grammar and mathematics and undertook writing assessment tasks. Children in Year 2 were also assessed in reading, writing and mathematics, primarily by teacher assessment. Both of these end of key stage assessments are compared to the national data. All three partner schools did extremely well, with our children achieving and making progress that is significantly better than expected.



We are particularly proud of how well children from disadvantaged backgrounds do compared to other pupils in England. These measures are an important recognition of the hard work of children and staff but also show that having a rich and exciting curriculum, alongside high expectations and great teaching, make a real difference in how well children do with these crucial reading, writing and mathematics skills. Governors have thanked leaders and their teams for the exceptional results achieved and we remain committed to ensuring continuing high standards that ensure children leave us 'secondary ready'.
