Our topic this half term is Splash





Communication and Language

We will be learning to:

- Hold conversation when engaged in back-andforth exchanges with our teacher and peers.
- Express our ideas and feelings about our experiences using full sentences, including use of past, present and future tenses and make use of conjunctions, with support from our teacher.



Literacy

We will be learning to:

- Retell stories and narratives using our own words and recently introduced vocabulary.
- Read aloud simple sentences and books that are consistent with our phonic knowledge, including some common exception words.
- Write simple phrases and sentences that can be read by others.



Maths

We will be learning to:

- Have a deep understanding of numbers to 10, including the composition of each number.
- Verbally count beyond 20, recognising the pattern of the counting system.
- Compare quantities up to 10 in different contexts, recognising when one quantity is greater than, less than or the same.







Physical Development

We will be learning to:

- Negotiate space and obstacles safely, with consideration for ourselves and others.
- Hold a pencil effectively in preparation for fluent writing - using the tripod grip in almost all cases.
- Use a range of small tools, including scissors, paintbrushes and cutlery.
- Show accuracy and care when drawing.





Understanding the World

We will be learning to:

- Know some similarities and differences between things in the past and now, drawing on our experiences and what has been read in class.
- Explain some similarities and differences between life in this country and life in other countries, drawing on knowledge from stories, non-fiction texts and, when appropriate, a map.



Expressive Art and Design

We will be learning to:

- Safely use and explore a variety of materials, tools and techniques, experimenting with colour, design, texture, form and function.
- Make use of props and materials when roleplaying characters in narratives and stories.
- Perform songs, rhymes, poems and stories with others and, when appropriate, try to move in time with music.



Personal, Social and **Emotional Development**

We will be learning to:

- Show an understanding of our own feelings and of others, and begin to regulate our behaviour accordingly.
- Build our confidence in trying new activities and show independence, resilience and perseverance in the face of challenge.
- Work and play cooperatively and take turns with others.
