You will remember that in May, I told you that Year 6 pupils across our family of schools were sitting their SATs tests. SATs measure a child's attainment in English (reading, grammar, punctuation, spelling) and maths. I am tremendously pleased and proud to tell you that pupils across the schools have done exceptionally well, outperforming pupils nationally and those in other schools in Hackney.
